

Our Lady, Star of the Sea, Pray for us! My dear Parishioners,

Today, Jesus calls himself "THE TRUE VINE". It is only when we know this rich symbolism can we appreciate the full force of Jesus' words in today's Gospel. Over the entrance of the Temple of Jerusalem in Jesus' day was a gilded relief of a vine with grape clusters as tall as a man. It symbolized God's people. God had delivered them under Moses from slavery in Egypt. God had "planted" his people, one of the psalms said, in the land they now called their own, as a farmer plants a vine (Psalm 80: 8-16).

In calling himself the "true vine", Jesus implies a contrast: Israel (God's people) had failed; they had not been true to their divine mandate. By their unfaithfulness, they had failed to produce the harvest God was after. Jesus had been true—His death being his final act of faithful obedience to His Father's will.

This statement also applies to us. As followers of Jesus, we too must bear fruit. A condition required for us to bear fruit is that we must remain united to him and seek to do his will. The person who remains united with him, Jesus said "will produce abundantly". He went further to say: "If you live in me, and my words stay part of you, you may ask what you will and it will be done for you."

Jesus is not saying that we will have some kind of supernatural power to do or get anything we want. He is rather saying that if we are truly united to him in heart, mind and will, our prayers and requests would always be in harmony with what he wants. Hence the Father would always be able to grant these requests.

The Father is the vinegrower who cares for the branches in two ways: by burning the unfaithful ones, and by pruning those that bear fruit. The Father trims and cleans the branches to increase their yield.

When we experience hardship, injustice and suffering, we naturally ask: Why me? What did I do to deserve this? Such questions are unanswerable. Jesus' words in today's Gospel do not answer such questions. Rather, they are a challenge: to view setbacks and suffering as opportunities to grow. The image of God as a vinegrower is like that

of a gardener pruning and cutting off the new green shoots on a vine, so that all the growth can be concentrated in the few early blooming branches which the gardener has elected to bear fruit. Pruning is often very painful but it leads to a fruitful abundant harvest. Jesus calls us to submit to the vinegrower's pruning, and so to glorify the Father by producing abundant fruit.

Sunday Mass Readings

Reading 1: Acts 9:26-31

Psalm: <u>Psalm 22:26–28</u>, <u>30–32</u> Reading 2: <u>1 John 3:18–24</u>

Gospel: John 15:1-8

The Fifth Sunday of Easter continues our journey through the sayings of Jesus in the Gospel of John. Today's reading is taken from that Last Supper discourse and it's Jesus' famous analogy of the vine and the branches.

Jesus is making this analogy of vine and branches not just any time during his public ministry, he's doing it at the Last Supper. This is important because during the Last Supper, we know from the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke, he actually took a chalice of wine and said, "this is my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant." So in that context of having instituted the Eucharist, which involves bread and wine, it's not inconsequential that he's going to compare himself to a grapevine. This isn't just any kind of vine, this is a grapevine..the context here is sacramental. Jesus has just identified a chalice with the fruit of the grape, or the blood of the grape as the Bible calls it, with his own blood.

Jesus says that he is the vine, his Father is the vine dresser, and his disciples are the branches off of the vine, which are supposed to bear fruit (that's why you plant a grapevine, you want it to bear fruit). Jesus then takes this analogy and talks about the two different kinds of branches on this grapevine that he himself i: branches that bear fruit and branches that don't. The fruitless branches – first, they are cut off from Christ. It says here that the vine dresser takes them away because they do not abide in him. Second, they are cut off and then they are thrown into the fire. Whenever Jesus uses the imagery of fire in the gospels, he's frequently doing it with reference to the fire of Gehenna, to the place of the damned. Jesus is saying that if you are a member of his body (if you're a branch and you're part of the vine, i.e. you're one of his disciples) but you don't keep his word, you don't obey his commandments, you don't actually bear fruit, then God, the vine dresser, the Father, is going to do to you what any vine dresser would do to a branch that's not bearing fruit – he'll cut it off and throw it into the fire.

By contrast, there are the fruitful branches. Jesus says that every branch that does bear fruit he prunes that it may bear more fruit. What does pruning mean? How can the Father prune us? Think of a person who's gardening; sometimes a branch will bear fruit but in

order to get it to bear more fruit you will cut off some of the excess, you'll prune it. Anything that's not actually necessary you cut off and it gives more of the sap to the fruit, so that it is able to bear more fruit. Another aspect of this branch is that it abides in the vine, it abides in the main vine, and that apart from that main vine it can't do anything. Again, this is obvious if you've ever gardened. Sometimes when gardening, you accidentally cut off a branch that was in fact good. Well once that branch is cut off from the vine, it's not going to bear any fruit, it's going to die. Because apart from the vine, apart from the trunk, it can't bear any fruit. Everything it has, all the life that it produces, all the fruit that it produces, comes from the vine itself. So what Jesus is trying to do here is teach the disciples the principle, the necessity, of remaining in him, of abiding in him. If he is truly the vine and they are the branches, that any fruit that they bear really isn't going to be from them. It's going to be from him and from the Father that will prune them, so that they can bear more fruit.

So this is a beautiful image here of the life of Christian discipleship and also of apostolic activity, of evangelization, of bearing fruit for the nature of the kingdom. Jesus basically gives us the essential principle for any kind of apostolic work or evangelization, and that's this, unless you abide in me you can't do anything, you can't bear any fruit. Apart from me you can do nothing he says. This is important to emphasize because sometimes we can be tempted to think, well apart from Christ I can do some things well but with Christ I can do even better. That's not what Jesus says. He doesn't say apart from me you can do some things and you need me to kind of beef it up. What he says is apart from me you can do nothing, because the work of the vine dresser and the work of the vine is supernatural. He's talking about evangelization, he's talking about the spread of the kingdom of God, which is essentially supernatural in character.

This is what the Catechism of the Catholic Church says on how we too can abide in Christ and bear fruit (CCC 2074):

Jesus says: "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing." The fruit referred to in this saying is the holiness of a life made fruitful by union with Christ. When we believe in Jesus Christ, partake of his mysteries, and keep his commandments, the Savior himself comes to love, in us, his Father and his brethren, our Father and our brethren. His person becomes, through the Spirit, the living and interior rule of our activity.

Notice what the catechism identifies is the fruit: The fruit is the holiness of a life marked by union with Christ; the way we bear fruit is to remain united to him. Second, the way we remain united to him is to believe, so through faith. To partake of his mysteries; the mysteries is an Eastern way of referring to the sacraments. So, stay in the sacraments and the life of the church. And then finally, to keep his commandments. So faith, sacraments, and works - all three of those things go together.

It's not our works by themselves that unites us with Christ, but it's our works through grace that manifest our union with Christ and him working in us. And then third and finally, when we do all these things, Christ himself becomes "the living and interior rule of our activity". That's a radical thing to realize. What the Catechism is basically saving there is that when we believe in Christ, obey Christ, and remain in the sacramental life of the church, whenever we do bear fruit, it's not actually us acting, it's Christ acting in us, it's him bearing fruit in us, it's him becoming the living and interior rule of our activity.

This is St. John's way of expressing what Paul says: "It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me." (Galatians 2:20) And if you really begin to believe that and to live on it, it will totally change your life, to realize that everything good that I do, whatever good that I do is actually Christ living and working in me; and then the challenge becomes to live a life of holiness that's worthy of the Christ who dwells within me.




